We received a generous donation of more than 30 large boxes filled with thick, fleece throws, bedding, snoods, fleece blankets and hoodies.

To support the Earthquake crisis in Turkey and Syria, we immediately packaged up over 150 hoodies and throws, and 1000 antibacterial wipes, liquid solution and plasters.

CBP's own Yusuf Musa arranged for a container to be flown to the Syria/Turkey border last week and fly there himself to help the distribution.

We are so proud of you Yusuf, keep safe!

We have additional hoodies and blankets still available and we will be distributing them to our local community and other who may need them over the coming weeks.

CBP have a long-standing relationship with Nimtech, who are based at the Crown paint manufacturing site in Darwen.

Nimtech very kindly donate top quality paint to us when a particular product is available. Joanne and Victoria donned their overalls to attend Nimtech HQ to fill our own buckets with paint – a win, win for the environment, because the buckets are also reclaimed from Bright Blue Foods (a local bakery).

Joe and Vic decanted 46 buckets with brilliant 'white matt emulsion (460 litres) and 360 litres of Shed and Fence paint.

The unwanted surplus paint is diverted from the waste stream and redistributed for reuse at a fraction of the retail cost and is accessible for all.

That's 820 litres of paint not going to landfill!
